

ISTE Board of Directors Nomination Application Summary

This summary of required items is intended to help you prepare your ISTE Board of Directors application materials. All applications must be submitted according to the ISTE election guidelines posted at iste.org. Applicants must have been an ISTE member for a minimum of three years and be willing to undergo a background screening if selected for the ballot.

Experience in the following areas:

- Board experience (The ISTE Board is not the first board on which the candidate has served)
- Governance oversight (Looks at the organization from a broad lens)
- Public policy advocacy (at the local, state or federal levels)
- Financial management oversight (organizational budget responsibility, fiscal accountability, and investments)
- Community affiliation (involvement with the greater ISTE community)
- Strategic leadership
- Global perspective

Required items:

- Demographic information about you, your job role and your experience in education.
- Awards or professional honors received.
- Previous volunteer or professional service with ISTE and relevant service outside ISTE.
- Affiliates and other networks you belong to and leadership roles held.
- Board work characteristics (150-word limit per response):
 - Experience as a member of a board of directors.
 - Engagement in education advocacy.
- Answers to these questions (150-word limit per response):
 - What do you think are the three most salient issues in educational technology and how do those issues impact PK-12 education, higher education and the educational community?
 - What opportunities and challenges do you envision in ISTE's future?
- Short bio (150-word limit).
- Two-minute video response explaining why you're interested in serving on the ISTE board, to be showcased online.
- Your resume/CV.
- Your online presence (LinkedIn, website, blog, twitter) Optional.
- Your photo.
