## ISTE Teacher Education Network Award for Excellence in Teacher Education

This award recognizes an outstanding teacher educator who advances the field, demonstrates vision and innovation, and improves learning and teaching.

## Only college/university faculty members or PK-12 state, district, or school employees who work directly with teacher preparation and/or professional development programs for educators are eligible to apply for this award.

The following questions will be asked on this award form:

- 1. (Required) Please upload a current CV or Resume
- 2. (Required) Please provide a brief biography of yourself and your work (500 words max)
- 3. (Required) Please provide a letter of support from your direct supervisor or chief of staff representative (e.g. dean, director, principal, district superintendent, etc) that addresses your impact within the organization.
- 4. (Optional) If desired, provide an additional letter of support. This can be from another supervisor, administrator, colleague, or student.
- 5. (Required) Provide and describe two artifacts that demonstrate your impact and innovation in the field of educational technology and teacher education (research article, strategic plan, curriculum, project report, etc.).
- 6. (Required) Please provide a narrative statement that describes your specific role in supporting the effective use of digital technology to support teaching and learning of future and practicing educators. <u>Please use the evaluation criteria</u> to guide the outline of the narrative. The narrative should discuss pedagogy, scholarship, service, impact, leadership, and professional growth. The following prompts may help invoke specific examples and/or provide structure for the narrative:
  - a. How have your teaching activities included and promoted innovative technology-rich pedagogical practices?
  - b. How have you contributed to the field of educational technology and teacher education through scholarly activities?
  - c. How have you furthered the field of teaching with technology through participation in community or service activities (including educator mentorships and professional development opportunities)?
  - d. How has your work had a significant positive impact on technology use, teaching, and learning in your educational community (whether locally, regionally, statewide, nationally, or worldwide)?
  - e. How have you exhibited leadership in your school and/or professional community with a vision of technology infusion?

f. How have you engaged in ongoing professional learning activities to continually develop their practice as an evidence-based practitioner?
