Description

ISTE Distinguished Districts are US school districts that are moving the needle in big ways throughout a school system. These districts search out and embrace change to improve teaching and learning, reach all students, and serve as an example for other schools to follow. Candidates:

- Demonstrate effectiveness and innovation in the use of technology throughout their district.
- Ensure equitable, accessible and appropriate technology use for all students, and are focused on improving learner outcomes and continuously enhancing the learning experience.
- Bring along all stakeholders, including staff, students, families and the community, in the process.

Core Questions

- Why do you and the district you're nominating feel it's important to be innovative and to support and empower effective, forward-thinking educators? (200 word max)
- Describe the technology planning process and how it's incorporated in the overall district mission. Include how ISTE Standards for Education Leaders, for Educators, and for Students are applied. (200 word max)
- Describe the effectiveness and evidence of impact of the innovative work at the teacher and student levels. (200 word max)
